Celebrating our Diamond Jubilee!

As you are aware, this year, we celebrated the Year of our Diamond Jubilee, where in 2024 we rejoiced in 60 years of educating girls in the Josephite tradition. Our theme for the year was our value of spirit, which invited all in our community to come together, to work, in the spirit of Mary MacKillop, carrying the spirit of those Josephite sisters and staff who began the school 60 years ago to be the face of bold hope for our young people.

From humble beginnings that started in a house on the corner of Bage Street called Maryvale, sixty years ago the Sisters of St Joseph opened an all-girls Catholic College, in the bold hope to educate women for the future. It was the determination of visionary educationalist Sr Vincent who deeply believed in young women achieving their potential. Working with the community, the sisters opened Mt St Joseph's School for girls in 1964. In 2024, we continued to build upon their legacy and are grateful for the trust of the sisters to continue the important work of empowering young women to lead us into the future.

Our beautiful painting by Kylie Farrelly, Spirit of the Jubilee reminded us that grounded in our traditions, we are to continue to find the strength to be this face of hope for our young people, to empower them through quality learning experiences, challenge their way of looking at the world in which they live, and then flourish in their own differences and giftedness contributing to the world.

Sister Anne Cannon

Sister Anne Cannon, a cherished alumna from the Class of 1963, has continued her journey of faith and service as a Sister of St. Joseph. Her life's work reflects the values of compassion, unity, and service imparted by Mary MacKillop College, inspiring current students to carry forward the legacy of St. Mary MacKillop in their own lives.



Sister Anne Cannon began her journey at Mt St Joseph's in 1963, during a formative year before the school officially opened. Her memories of this unique time highlight the school's transition to compulsory secondary education in response to the changing educational landscape. With two small classrooms, three staff members, and around fifty students in four grades, Mt St Joseph's was then a humble establishment, with a makeshift toilet block under the trees and a lively, spirited move to the local Scout Hall, which fostered a lasting sense of community.

Sister Anne recalls the diverse student body, including girls from across Queensland, some with hopes of becoming Josephites, who joined in daily routines with the sisters. Amid these early days of Mt St Joseph's, Sister Anne found her path to become a Sister of St. Joseph alongside classmates, deepening her connection to the Josephite mission. Her journey reflects the school's foundational values and the enduring legacy of its beginnings.

Mary MacKillop College proudly welcomed back alumna Hilisha Monica Mary Samoa, who shared her remarkable journey from her school days to the global sporting stage. A student at MMC from Grades 8 to 12, Hilisha was the College Captain in 2003, a role in which she began to embody the leadership and determination that have since defined her career.

Hilisha's rugby journey started with her club, Norths, before she went on to represent Queensland Women's Rugby Union in 2005, earning Cap #58. Her dream of playing on the world stage came true in 2017 when she debuted for the Wallaroos with Cap #152 and competed in the Women's Rugby Union World Cup in Ireland. That same year, her talent and dedication was recognised when she was named Australia's Wallaroo Player of the Year.

Beyond rugby, Hilisha is now a mother of five and continues to excel in the sporting world. She has transitioned into American Football, representing Queensland at the Nationals in Western Australia. With sights set on representing Australia in Flag Football at the Olympics and competing in an American Football World Cup in Europe, her journey exemplifies resilience and ambition.

Hilisha returned to MMC to present an Australian jersey to the College and express her gratitude for the foundations built during her school years. Reflecting on the Early Days of MMC By Vicki Ward

The foundation years of Mary MacKillop College taught me invaluable life lessons—teamwork, leadership, self-reliance, and making the best of limited resources, all approached with a generous dose of humor.

In 1964, we spent much of our first year navigating construction sites, with mud planks leading to classrooms and the occasional bulldozer serenading us during exams. The challenges of those early days fostered resilience and community spirit among both students and teachers.

Student leadership was different then—less formal, but no less significant. With just a handful of Seniors, we all shared the responsibility of setting an example and building the fledgling school community. Opportunities to shine came in unexpected forms, from organising the school's first YCS (Young Christian Students) group to competing in unique events like an interschool table-setting competition.

The lessons I learned at MMC—about hard work, creativity, and building something that lasts—have stayed with me throughout my life. As Mary MacKillop might say, "Do what you can with the gifts you have and leave the rest to God."

Those early days remind us that true community is built not just for the present but for the future. I am grateful for the role MMC played in shaping my journey and hope these values continue to guide today's MacKillop women.

Exciting Updates: The McCormack Building


